Lampasas 4-H Shooting Sports to Begin

The Lampasas 4-H Shooting Sports Project will conduct a mandatory training session at 6:30 p.m. at the County Annex conference room located at 409 S. Pecan Street, Lampasas on Monday March 25th. This training is required in order to participate in the Shooting Sports Shotgun Project. Project participants from previous years are not required to attend this training. Please do not bring any firearms or ammo to the training and a personal shotgun is not required in order to participate in the project. Rick Baxter will lead the class and introduce new project leader Casey Garrett. Please RSVP that you plan to attend.

Youth ages 9-18 (grades 3-12) are eligible to participate in shotgun target events that will include skeet, trap and sporting clays. If you are not currently a 4-Her you can enroll at the extension office (409 S. Pecan St., Lampasas) or online at https://texas.4honline.com. Cost to enroll in 4-H is \$25. There is no cost to enroll in the project.

Participants should bring a parent or guardian to all meetings and shooting events.

Shoots will be scheduled and discussed at this first meeting. 4-Hers will need to attend the training class and attend at least two sessions at the range in order to complete the project. Opportunities will be scheduled throughout April and May.

Record Keeping and Record Books



Recordkeeping is a very valuable skill taught to members of the Texas 4-H program. Members are encouraged to keep project records and have these records reviewed annually by submitting a Texas 4-H Record book. The primary purposes of completing a record book are for a young person to develop the skills necessary to set goals, work toward achieving those goals, reflect on his/her experiences, and set new and higher goals for themselves. A secondary benefit is to prepare young people for the process of completing quality academic scholarship applications.

A record book must be turned in to receive awards such as Rookie, Silver Star & Gold Star Awards. The County Record book deadline is July 1 to be turned in to the Extension Office.

Educational presentations can be presented in subjects, such as beef, food & nutrition, clothing & textiles, companion animal, shooting sports, and family life, to name just a few. There is also one category that is called "open" or all those other cool projects 4-H members are doing on their own. The district roundup in San Angelo is May 4 at West

Texas Training Center and the state 4-H Roundup in College Station is June 10-14. County Agent, Karen DeZarn has printed material, a PowerPoint, and a VCR video describing demonstrations/educational presentations and talks.

Texas 4-H Roundup

Texas 4-H Roundup is a qualifying and invitational event for youth between the ages of 11 and 18 that have successfully placed in a qualifying event at the district level or signed up to compete in an invitational event at the state level. County and district Roundup's are open to all ages of 4-H members from 9 to 18. Texas 4-H Roundup includes approximately 50 different contests and workshops that test 4-H members on life skills in such attributes are decision making, public speaking, organization, and working with others. These contests include such things as Fashion Show, Food Show, an assortment of judging contests, and educational presentations. The 2013 Texas 4-H Roundup will be held in College Station, Texas on the campus of Texas A&M University from June 10th to June 14th, 2013.
