Share the Fun

Do you have a talent to share with your fellow 4-H members? Singing? Dancing? Playing an instrument? Acting? Then sign up for Share-The-Fun! Guidelines have been released and you can plan on the same six categories as last year: Celebrate 4-H, Choreographed Routines, Musical/Instrumental, Solo/Band Performance, Poetry/Prose, and Vocal. An entry can be an individual or in teams up to 9 4-H members. Check out the Texas 4-H Roundup webpage for the rules and more information!

The Share The-Fun-Contest will be held on May 5 in San Angelo at Howard College and Sr. winners advance to State which will be June 10, 2012. Youth may only compete in one Share-The- Fun Category.

OBJECTIVES:

- To provide an opportunity for 4-H youth to develop a spirit of cooperation through working together to develop self-confidence through public appearance.
- To stimulate interest and encourage a broadbased recreation program in Texas 4-H at the club and county level.
- To encourage 4-H members to discover and develop their talents.
- To provide for social, cultural, and leadership development of 4-H youth.

CATEGORY DESCRIPTIONS for Individuals or groups of 1-9 participants: Four (4) minutes for set-up and break down; maximum of six (6) minutes for presentation for a total of ten (10) minutes per act.

POETRY/PROSE - Acts which showcase poetry or prose are required.

VOCAL - Vocal presentation may be done a cappella or with an accompaniment CD/tape. All members in the act must be singing. No lip sync will be allowed.

MUSICAL – Musical presentation may be musical instruments accompanied by background tape or an instrumental performance only.

SOLO/BAND PERFORMANCE – All 4-H members entered in the category must be a part of the act by playing a musical instrument, singing, or both (solo performance must play an instrument and sing.)

CHOREOGRAPHED ROUTINES — No speaking to form a skit or story line. The act requires choreography and can be demonstrated through twirling, pom pom squad routines, jump rope teams, basketball dribbling exhibitions, or dance (jazz, tap, country & western, ballroom, etc.)

CELEBRATE 4-H – May be a 4-H based story line promoting 4-H, community service, a project, or activity. This category may also address a specific youth issue and present ways in which this issue can be addressed through 4-H efforts. May incorporate music, vocal selections, and/or choreographed routines but these aspects cannot be more than half of the performance. Skits can be humorous, creative and make fun of but not degrade Extension employees or the 4-H program. All 4-H members entered in the category must be a part of the act. Judging will be based on material chosen, talent, creativity, showmanship, costumes, and props.

4-H Educational Presentations

If you aren't already doing demonstrations or presentations at your 4-H club meetings now is the time to begin. Also if you want to participate in the district or state 4-H Roundup you need to begin practicing. An educational presentation or demonstration can be done in so many different areas. Texas 4-H Roundup is the event where all educational presentations are given for competition. The Texas 4-H Roundup Guide provides the updated categories detailed rules related to each category. Educational presentations can be presented in subjects, such as beef, food & nutrition, clothing & textiles, companion animal, shooting sports, and family life, to name just a few. There is also one category that is called "open" or all those other cool projects 4-H members are doing on their own. The district roundup in San Angelo is May 5 at Howard College and the state 4-H Roundup in Lubbock is June 10-14. County Agent, Karen DeZarn has printed material, a PowerPoint, and a VCR video describing demonstrations/educational presentations and talks. Let's see some involvement at the club, county, district and state level!!

Educational Presentation - any number of junior entries/3 senior entries per county

Share-the-Fun - 2 entries for juniors and 2 entries for Seniors per county. County deadline is April 9.

Scholarship Opportunity

The Texas Hill Country Dorper Sheep Association will award two college scholarships for the first time this fall in memory of one of the state's pioneers in the Dorper sheep industry.

The scholarships, valued at \$1,000 each, are open to any Texas resident. One will be awarded to a high school senior graduating this spring and the other to a college student who will be at least a junior in any Texas college or university this fall.

Scholarship requirements include involvement in agriculture, and especially the Dorper sheep industry in Texas. Recipients with agriculture-related majors in college will be given special consideration.

The scholarships have been launched in memory of Brad Bernhard, who died of cancer at the age of 48 in 2011. Bernhard, who lived in Fredericksburg, was one of the original founders of the THCDA and one of the earliest owners of Dorper sheep in Texas.

Dorpers and White Dorpers are hair sheep developed in South Africa in the 1930s as a breed that would thrive in a low-rainfall environment and produce a high-quality carcass. The THCDA was organized in 2007 to promote Dorper and White Dorper sheep in Texas.

Deadline for applications to be received is April 15, 2012. Applicants may complete a scholarship application form online or find out more about the two scholarships by going to the THCDA website at www.thcdorperassociation.com.

AVAILABLE TO PROMOTE YOUR COUNTY'S 4-H PROGRAM

Lampasas has already ordered and received 4 signs that are being posted at various points throughout the county. If you wish to participate, additional signs may be ordered before May 1. The Texas 4-H Program is now offering the opportunity for county 4-H Programs to purchase metal road signs that welcome visitors to your county. These signs are made with the same materials as Texas Department of Transportation road signs so they are quality, longlife signs. The signs are 36 X 48 inches and can have space for sponsorships information on the bottom of them. Each sign is \$150.00 which includes shipping and handling. Mounting of signs can done using either metal or wood post along the roadways on private property (make sure you receive permission from land owner first - don't want to lose a sign!!!). New 4-H Record Book System! Record Book deadlines:

County – June 20th, District July 5.

Have you started your 4-H Record Book? Recordkeeping is a very valuable skill taught to members of the Texas 4-H program. Members are encouraged to keep project records and have these records reviewed annually by submitting a Texas 4-H Record Book. In an effort to update the current Record Book system, a committee of 4-H faculty has polled 4-H members, 4-H parents, and Extension faculty to request suggestions to improve the process. It has been highly recommended and requested by many members, parents, and Extension staff that the Texas 4-H recordkeeping system (Record Books) be available as an online, data entry system that easily allows for updates, editing, and printing.

So, State 4-H announced. Important Details:

* There will be three (3) levels of *Record Books* based on 4-H age (junior, intermediate, and senior). Information requested for each level will progressively add on to each other. The junior & intermediate books will be significantly simplified

from the current *Record Book*. The senior level book will be similar to the current *Record Book* with some minor edits.

- * Parts of the report form will be standardized to allow for ease of completion and judging.
- * Much of the data from previous *Record Books* that a member may have saved on their home computer may be 'cut and pasted' into the new forms.
- * All 4-H members (juniors, intermediates, and seniors) will begin using the new online forms or new paper forms that will be available for download from the Texas 4-H website beginning with the 2011-2011 4-H Year.
- * Record Books will still be printed and turned in (in hardcopy form) to be judged by the deadline set by your local County Extension Office.
