# Make Fleece Blanket Community Service Project

Join the District 7 4-H Clothing Project Development Committee members in making fleece blankets for infants to benefit the Pregnancy Help Center of San Angelo. Blankets will be delivered to the District Fall Meeting on August 20. Anyone interested in making a blanket at a group meeting contact Karen DeZarn at the Extension office.

Directions for Tied Fleece Blanket Fleece

Adult 2 ½ yds. main color

2 1/2 yds. contrast color

Child 2 yds. main color

2 yds. contrast color

Tools you need

\*Sharp scissors

\*Cutting Mat for Rotary Cutting

\*Rotary Cutter – Med. Or large size

\*Shape Cut Ruler by June Tailor

#### **Instructions**

- 1. Using sharp scissors cut selvage edges off sides and straighten cut edges if needed.
- 2. Lay main fabric on top of contrast fabric wrong sides together
- 3. Using sharp scissors cut a 5 inch square from each of the corners.
- 4. Using ruler, rotary cutter and mat cut fringe 5" deep every inch along all the edges.
- 5. Tie the main and contrasting fabric fringe together into a square know (right over left, left over right). Continue tying all fringe being careful not to stretch fabric.

#### **Quality Counts Verification**

Quality Counts Verification is now active and ready to be used! Moving forward into the 2011-2012 Major Show Season, Quality Counts Verification will be a part of the process for entry in all major shows.

This means youth exhibitors will need to demonstrate their knowledge of the Six Pillars of Character and the Eight Core Concepts presented in the Quality Counts Curriculum. To do this, they will need to pass an online test on the website (<a href="http://qualitycounts.tamu.edu/">http://qualitycounts.tamu.edu/</a>) and acquire a Quality Counts Verification number. Do not lose this number! You will need it when entering

majors. If you lose it then you will have to take the test again and get a new number. You will not be allowed to enter without it.

#### Things you need to know about Verification:

- 2011 State Fair of Texas will implement Quality Counts Verification on a voluntary basis.
- 2012 All Major Livestock Shows in Texas will require Quality Counts Verification at the time of entry - This means youth will need to be verified prior to entry in the fall of 2011
- A Verification number is obtained by answering 80% of the questions correctly on an online test.

The Quality Counts website (<a href="http://qualitycounts.tamu.edu/">http://qualitycounts.tamu.edu/</a>) will serve as your portal to the online test. The website should also answer any questions you have concerning Quality Counts Verification. If you have any other questions please give me a call.

Quality Counts training will be offered this fall, however, you are more than welcome to do the online training version and go ahead and take the test and get verified.
