



Quality Counts

Quality Counts Verification is a part of the process for entry county shows. The Quality Counts Verification Number is required to be included on the entry forms in order for the exhibitors to show at any of our Junior, lackpot, Scramble Shows.

This means youth exhibitors will need to demonstrate their knowledge of the Six Pillars of Character and the Eight Core Concepts presented in the

Quality Counts Curriculum. To do this, they will need in all 2017-2018 major & to pass an online test on the website:

> http://qualitycounts.tamu.edu/ and acquire a Quality Counts Verification number. A Verification number is obtained by answering 80% of the questions correctly on an online test. If you lose it, then you will have to take the test again and get a new number. You will not be allowed to enter majors without it.

Lampasas 4-H had 2 teams entered in the Food & Nutrition Quiz Bowl on November 7th.


The Senior team (back row) was comprised of Kasi Andrews, Gary Swain, and Jerald Swain placed 3rd.

Scholarship

The 2018 Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo Scholarship Applications went live November 13th. The scholarship will be awarded in the amount of \$20,000!!!!

I am sending this information on behalf of Lampasas County Area Go Texan and the "Area Go Texan Scholarship" however there are several types of scholarships that OUR Lampasas County students can apply for as well...

Please look at the SAT guidelines and minimum test scores that apply to the different types of applications... The Area Go Texan requirement is 950 minimum score with the Math and Verbal scores only!! Yes, they have changed, only using two of the scores and they DO NOT have to come from the same test.. Student's BEST score in each category will be used...

When students apply, they will "check boxes" for all of the types that they are applying for (ex: AGT, Military, Exhibitor) but the student can only win one scholarship...

The Area Go Texan scholarship is available for any graduating senior from Lampasas or Lometa high school going to a state supported university. They DO NOT have to be majoring in an agricultural field or have shown in Houston...

There are 2 scholarships that allow home schooled students to apply... Exhibitor & 4-H Feel free to call me for a visit about the scholarship opportunities or I'll gladly drop off printed materials as well...

I will come talk with your students and/or parents, during or after school, about our HLSR & County scholarship and the general idea and importance of scholarships and their future as young adults if you would like... I will also do this in smaller groups if there is a need...
