The 2016 Texas 4-H Photography Rules and Guidelines are now available online. The categories have remained the same for the 2016 contest; however, some of the descriptions have been

updated to address questions pertaining to what is allowable in each of the categories. The optional theme category for 2016 is: 4-H, Ribbons, Awards & Recognition. The theme will focus on Still Life arrangements of 4-H Awards & ribbons. The arrangement and position of the item will be strongly evaluated as well as the quality of the photo. Photo should create emotion

Texas 4-H Roundup

Texas 4-H Roundup is a qualifying and invitational event for youth between the ages of II and I8 that have successfully placed in a qualifying event at the district level or signed up to compete in an invitational event at the state level. County and district Roundup's are open to all ages of 4-H members from 9 to 18. Texas 4-H Roundup includes approximate-

ly 50 different contests and workshops that test 4-H members on life skills in such attributes are decision making, public speaking, organization, and working with others. These contests include such things as Fashion Show, Food Show, an assortment of judging contests, and educational presentations. The 2016 Texas 4-H Roundup will be held in College Station, Texas on

the campus of Texas A&M University from June 6th to June 10th, 2016. http://texas4-h.tamu.edu/

The qualifying event is the District 7 4H Roundup to be held on May 7 at the West Texas Training Center in San Angelo. The county deadline for submission is April 15th so be getting ready.

Awesome Team Project—Consumer Decision Making

Good consumer skills can help you get more for your money. Consumer Decision Making (CDM) gives youth the opportunity to make wise decisions when shopping. CDM is a judging contest designed to teach kids to observe, compare and make consumer based decisions based on facts. 4-Hers use their consumer knowledge to rank similarly based products to fit a given scenario. Kids learn to organize their thoughts and to

defend their decisions in oral reasons. CDM is a great way to learn how to shop better! There are 3-5 members per team. Two practices are scheduled in Lometa on February 4th and 11th at 4:00 p.m. at the Lometa School. Practices can also be scheduled in Lampasas if there is interest. Individuals can compete.

Monday, February 5th is the County Deadline for CDM Teams.

Friday, February 19th is the Dis-

trict Consumer Contest— at the San Angelo Stock Show. There is a possible large cash award for the senior division.

Texas Brigades Summer Camp

camps: Bobwhite Brigade, Buckskin Brigade, Bass Brigade, Waterfowl Brigade, Ranch Brigade, and Coastal Brigade. You will be introduced to habitat management, hone your communication skills, and develop a land ethic. The state's leading

Texas 4-H Roundup is the event where all educational presenta-

tions are given for competition.

The Texas 4-H Roundup Guide provides the updated categories and detailed rules related to each category. Educational presentations can be presented in subjects, such as beef, food & nutrition, clothing & textiles, companion animal, shooting sports, and family life, to name just a few. There is also one category that is called "open" or all those other cool projects 4-H members are doing on their own. The district roundup in San Angelo is May 7 at West Texas Training Center and the state 4-H Roundup in College Station is June 6-10. County Agent, Karen DeZarn has printed material, a PowerPoint, and a VCR video describing demonstrations/educational presentations and talks.

Let's see some involvement at the club, county, district and state level!!

Educational Presentation - any number of junior entries /3 senior entries per county

Share-the-Fun - 2 entries for juniors and 2 entries for seniors per county. Wouldn't it be nice for there to be so many entries that we could have a county Share-the-fun/Roundup???

Duds to Dazzle—Clothing (Recycling) Project

4-H members form teams of no less than three and no more than five members. Teams will be assigned one of the following categories: Wearable, Accessory/Jewelry, or Nonwearable. Teams will use the item(s) provided along with any supply closet items to design and create a unique product. Each team will have 60 minutes to complete their finished product. While teams do not select their category beforehand, they can still prepare for the competition. Ample preparation will give them confidence and the skills to help them do their best. Preparation

can include having practice challenges, studying contest resources and the design process, learning how to care for textiles, becoming knowledgeable on safety precautions to utilize while sewing and crafting, learning about consumer purchasing trends and different venues, and gaining knowledge on how to price and market merchandise for a target audience.

In addition to designing and constructing an item, team members must provide a 5 minute presentation to a panel of judges. At least three team

members must have speaking roles in the presentation. Judges may also ask questions of the team members. Reviewing the score card for Duds to Dazzle will help 4-H members prepare for the presentation and question-and-answer segment of the judging process.

Contact Karen DeZarn if you are interested in participating in this project. After School dates can be scheduled. Project leaders are needed as well. The county deadline to register for all ages grades 3-12 is March 22nd and the district contest is April 7 in Coleman.

Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo Scholarships

The 2016 Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo Scholarship Applications went live November 4th.

I am sending this information on behalf of Lampasas County Area Go Texan and the "Area Go Texan Scholarship" however there are several types of scholarships that OUR Lampasas County students can apply for as well...

Please look at the new SAT guidelines and minimum test scores that apply to the different types of applications... The Area Go Texan requirement is 950 minimum score with the Math and Verbal scores only!! Yes, they have changed, only using two of the scores and they do not have to come

from the same test. Student's BEST score in each category will be used...

When students apply, they will "check boxes" for all of the types that they are applying for (ex: AGT, Military, Exhibitor) but the student can only win one scholarship...

Something new... There are 2 scholarships that allow home schooled students to apply... Exhibitor & 4-H.

Feel free to call me for a visit about all the new changes and I'll gladly drop off printed materials as well...

I will come talk with your students and/or parents, during or after school, about our HLSR & County scholarship and the general idea and importance of scholarships and their future as young adults if you would like... I will also do this in smaller groups if there is a need...



Eli's Fund

A Memorial for Lance Corporal Colton Rusk and Eli, his service dog

November 2015 – June 2016

Eli, a bomb-sniffing military working dog was assigned to US Lance Cpl. Colton Rusk. In December, 2010, Lance Cpl. Rusk was killed by sniper fire in Afghanistan. Eli, ever faithful to his handler was left depressed and alone. He would not leave Lance Cpl. Rusk's cot at the base for several weeks. In February 2011 Lance Cpl. Rusk's family in South Texas was allowed to adopt Eli. The Texas Veterinary Medical Foundation (College of Veterinary Medicine, CVM) has pledged to cover all of Eli's veterinary care for the rest of his life. The CVM established Eli's Fund as a source of financial support for active duty service men and women, medically retired veterans' service animals and retired military animals.

Goal: \$15,000
