All market lambs and goats must be slick sheared BEFORE arriving at the barn on Thursday, January 7. In addition, all breeding goats need to be at least "roughed

in" prior to arriving at the show.

If you need help shearing/clipping your sheep or goats, Saturday, January 2 beginning at noon, I will be at the show barn to help you get that done. Please let me know if you plan on coming. You will be able to wash (with hot water), and get your sheep and goats fitted that day. I will have 2 sets of clippers, 2 trim stands, and a blow dryer available for you to use if you need. Also, please bring any equipment of your own that you may have as this will speed things up.

Barn set up/prep is Saturday January 2 at 9 am and everyone is expected to attend and help get the barn ready for the show.

Everyone (all species) will need to provide their own shavings again this year.

Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo Scholarships

The 2016 Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo Scholarship Applications went live November 4th. I am sending this information on behalf of Lampasas County Area Go Texan and the "Area Go Texan Scholarship" however there are several types of scholarships that OUR Lampasas County students can apply for as well...

Please look at the new SAT guidelines and minimum test scores that apply to the different types of applications... The Area Go Texan requirement is 950 minimum score with the Math and Verbal scores only!! Yes, they have changed, only using two of the scores and they do not have to come from the same test. Student's BEST score in each category will be used...

When students apply, they will "check boxes" for all of the types that they are applying for (ex: AGT, Military, Exhibitor) but the student can only win one scholarship...

Something new... There are 2 scholarships that allow home schooled students to apply... Exhibitor & 4-H. Feel free to call me for a visit about all the new changes and I'll gladly drop off printed materials as well...

I will come talk with your students and/or parents,

during or after school, about our HLSR & County scholarship and the general idea and importance of scholarships and their future as young adults if you would like... I will also do this in smaller groups if there is a need...

County photography information night is Monday, January 18th at 6 p.m. at the Extension office. The 2016 Texas 4-H Photography Rules and Guidelines are now available online. The categories have remained the same for the 2016 contest; however, some of the descriptions have been updated to address questions pertaining to what is allowable

in each of the categories. The optional theme category for 2016 is: 4-H, Ribbons, Awards & Recognition. The theme will focus on Still Life arrangements of 4-H Awards & ribbons. The arrangement and position of the item will be strongly evaluated as well as the quality of the photo. Photo should create emotion and have impact.
