<u>Lampasas County 4-H Photography</u> Results

Twelve Lampasas County 4-Hers will advance to the district and state photography competition. New this year for the senior level 4-Hers was digital entry for their photography competition. Victoria Long, Travis Tschoerner and Fern Pratt will compete in the senior division. Victoria entered pictures in 6 and received champion details/macros category. It was a beautiful close up picture of a leaf. Travis received reserve champion with a black and white picture of an abandoned wrecked automobile in the Catch all category. There is no district competition for the Sr. 4-Hers. They submit their photos directly to state.

The Jr. /Intermediate 4-H winners were due to San Angelo on April 15th. Twenty-six pictures advanced in 11 categories. Champion in this division went to

This year there are special training workshops to help everyone understand various 4-H projects and activities. Let's load up the cars and caravan to nearby counties for these trainings to be held from 6:30-8:30 p.m. The topics, dates and locations are:

Record Books - May 10 in San Saba at the Civic Center in Mill Pond Park

Program Management (Working with club manager, club officer, county council, volunteer leader assoc., etc) - **July 21** in Brady (Other dates are available, but are in counties farther away. Check with the Extension office for dates and locations.)

District Leadership Lab

Districts 7 and 10 Council Teams have joined forces to create a Leadership-Lab experience you will never forget! The event will be held June 29-July1, 2011 at the one and only Texas 4-H Conference Center in Brownwood, Texas. Come and join other 4-Her's from District 7 and 10 and enjoy three days and three nights of fun as we work together to build leadership skills and character necessary for success! There will be four outstanding and innovative workshops that you can take back to you counties. They include: Parliamentary Procedure, Thinking Outside the Box, Communication & Marketing, and Creative Leadership Strategies. Participants must be 13 by June 29. Registration will be via the 4-H Connect May 1-15. Late registration will be May 16-20. The late fee is \$20. Go to ://texas.4honline.com The cost of the Leadership Lab will be \$220. The county will pay ½ if the participant will bring back to the county what they have learned and help train others. We will integrate what they learn into the county program. 4-H Healthy Lifestyles Invitational

The 4-H Healthy Lifestyles Invitational Contest is scheduled for the afternoon of Thursday, June 16th, during Texas 4-H Roundup. The contest is open to all intermediate and senior 4-H youth age 13-18. 4-H members do **not** have to qualify in order to participate in this invitational contest. Members may enter as an individual or a member of a county team. Teams shall be made up of 3-4 youth within the same age division. 4-H members entered as individuals will be randomly grouped with other individuals to form a team for the team presentation portion of the contest. Best efforts will be made by the contest planning team to group individuals into 4-member teams. Eight classes will provide a situation on various healthy lifestyles topics, with class topics being:

* Teens & safe driving habits

- Substance abuse
- Sun safety
- Sports nutrition
- General nutrition/nutrient functions
- Fad diets
- Altering Recipes
- Passenger safety
