2016 Horse Validation

Open on 4-H Connect March I through May I.

- March I April 15 \$10 per horse
- April 16 May 1 \$20 per horse

Horses must be **owned** and **validated** by the 4-H member, their parents, grandparents, legal guardian, or sibling

by **May** Ist of each year. A horse that has been validated before must be re-validated (and paid) each year, if it is to be shown.

The validation of multiple horses is encouraged, so the 4 -H member has options, in case of an unforeseen accident, injury, or death of one of the horses.

Texas 4-H Roundup

Texas 4-H Roundup is a qualifying and invitational event for youth between the ages of 11 and 18 that have successfully placed in a qualifying event at the district level or signed up to compete in an invitational event at the state level. County and district Roundup's are open to all ages of 4-H members from 9 to 18. Texas 4-H Roundup includes approximate-

ly 50 different contests and workshops that test 4-H members on life skills in such attributes are decision making, public speaking, organization, and working with others. These contests include such things as Fashion Show, Food Show, an assortment of judging contests, and educational presentations. The 2016 Texas 4-H Roundup will be held in College Station, Texas on

Texas Section Society for Range Management 62nd

Youth Range Workshop

Join participants from across Texas June 26 – July 1, 2016 at the Texas Tech University Campus in Junction, TX for the nation's longest running natural resources workshop for youth.

At the TSSRM Youth Range Workshop, participants gain useful knowledge and skills in the areas of ecology, inventory practices, management and evaluation of resources. Experts from across the state are recruited to teach the participants in fields ranging from watershed management, to prescribed burning, to soil health, and many areas in between.

Additionally, youth are trained in the areas of public speaking, advocacy, and leadership, so that they are armed with the knowledge they need to effectively educate others in the area of rangeland management, regardless of the career path they ultimately choose. The workshop is open to youth who are 14-18 years old, and have completed the 8th grade, but have not graduated from high school.

The workshop is \$350, and includes all meals, lodging, and educational materials needed during the week. Participants are encouraged to seek out sponsorships from various sources, including soil and water conservation districts or local ranches, and are then asked to go back after the workshop to present what they learned to those sponsors.

Veterinary Science Summer Camp

The goal of the Texas 4-H Veterinary Science Camp is to provide experiential learning opportunities for students participating in the Veterinary Science Certification Program (VSCP). Students will learn and practice clinical skills on large and small animals, while under the supervision of a veterinarian. Students may earn 33 of the 78 skill hours required for the VSCP certification process.

- Cost: \$150.00 (includes room, meals, materials, and Texas 4-H Roundup registration fee).
- Limited to the first 20 members who register. (Preference will be given to students participating in an organized veterinary science program.)
- Sign up through 4-H CONNECT under 2016 4-H Roundup (Sign up dates: April 15 May 20, 2016)
- Open to 4-H members 11–18 years old who DID NOT attend last year.
- Drop off participants on Monday, June 6 and pick them up on Thursday, June 9 after the contest.
- Chaperones and transportation provided for all participants.

Eli's Fund

A Memorial for Lance Corporal Colton Rusk and Eli, his service dog

November 2015 – June 2016

Eli, a bomb-sniffing military working dog was assigned to US Lance Cpl. Colton Rusk. In December, 2010, Lance Cpl. Rusk was killed by sniper fire in Afghanistan. Eli, ever faithful to his handler was left depressed and alone. He would not leave Lance Cpl. Rusk's cot at the base for several weeks. In February 2011 Lance Cpl. Rusk's family in South Texas was allowed to adopt Eli. The Texas Veterinary Medical Foundation (College of Veterinary Medicine, CVM) has pledged to cover all of Eli's veterinary care for the rest of his life. The CVM established Eli's Fund as a source of financial support for active duty service men and women, medically retired veterans' service animals and retired military animals.

Goal: \$15,000
