4-H One Day

The Texas 4-H Youth Development Program is excited to release the information for the 2015 One Day 4-H and to announce a "featured" service project for our seventh year of "Making a Difference In One Day" - One Day 4-H.

The 2015 event will take place on Saturday, October 10, 2015 across the state of Texas. This day will conclude our celebrations for the 2015 National 4-H Week scheduled for October 4th to 10th. As in the past each 4-H program on the club, county, and district level can select the focus of their project based on the needs of their community(s). However, for 2015, we are offering a "ready-made" community service project for each county in collaboration with the Texas A&M Forest Service. In 2015, the Texas A&M Forest Service is celebrating their 100th year of conserving and protecting Texas forests. As part of their celebration, Texas 4-H is joining with them to host an educational event to plant a commemorative Bur Oak Tree (the only tree that is adaptable to all 254 counties) in each of our counties as a One Day 4-H Project. This project is a great opportunity for 4-H to partner with the Commissioners Court or other local government to honor the purpose of the Forest Service by planting a tree on the public property for decades to enjoy and appreciate.

Lampasas' 4-H One Day is scheduled for October 10 at 9 am on the south side of the court house. This year's project is a commemoration of the 100th Anniversary of the Texas Forest Service in partnership the AgriLife Extension with a planting of a Burr Oak Tree on the south side of the County Court House. Let's have a good showing for this event.



A fundamental purpose of the 4-H Program is to highlight our program's success and especially the youth that are involved in it. Each year, during National 4-H Week, the local and county 4-H clubs/groups have the opportunity to showcase what they have gained from their membership in 4-H through activities and events at the local and county level. The Texas 4-H Youth Development Program develops a National 4-H Week Kit to help County Extension Offices, 4-H members, and volunteers design a National 4-H Week plan that works for them. National 4-H Week will be October 4-10, 2015.

QUALITY COUNTS

Quality Counts Verification will be a part of the process for entry in all 2015-2016 major & county shows. This year at the Heart O' Texas Livestock Show, we will be following along with other Major Livestock Shows across Texas and supporting the Quality Counts Program. Along with the State Fair of Texas, this fall we will be requiring the Quality Counts Verification Number to be included on the entry forms in order for the exhibitors to show at any of our Junior, Jackpot and Scramble Shows.

This means youth exhibitors will need to demonstrate their knowledge of the Six Pillars of Character and the Eight Core Concepts presented in the Quality Counts Curriculum. To do this, they will need to pass an online test on the website (http://qualitycounts.tamu.edu/) and acquire a Quality Counts Verification number. A Verification number is obtained by answering 80% of the questions correctly on an online test. You will need it when entering majors. If you lose it then you will have to take the test again and get a new number. You will not be allowed to enter without it.

District 7 4-H Scholarship Training

Any 4-Her interested in applying for a 4-H Scholarship there will be a training from 6:30-8:30 p.m. at the Llano County Extension Office on December 8. It would be beneficial for our youth to hear this message prior to their senior year, so we are encouraging Freshman, Sophomores, and Juniors to attend if they are interested. Many of the things that end up making youth not eligible cannot be fixed by the time they are seniors so it does not hurt for them to hear this info early!

2015 Junior Leadership Retreat

Join us for the 2015 Junior Leadership Retreat November 13-15 at the Texas 4-H Conference Center. It will be a great weekend full of fun, dancing and making great friends. Registration is now open!

BROWNWOOD – 4-H members ages 9-14 accompanied by adult chaperones will have an opportunity to hone their skills in several program

areas during the Junior Leadership Retreat Nov. 7-9 at the Texas 4-H Conference Center near Lake Brownwood.

"The Junior Leadership Retreat features Texas 4-H Council members conducting hands-on educational workshops with younger 4-H members," said Mark Carroll, center program director.

The 4-H Junior Leadership Retreat at Lake Brownwood will be Nov. 13-15. The program will focus on knowledge and skills in five different project areas. (Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service photo)

He said this year's program will focus on increasing knowledge and skills in five 4-H project areas — Livestock Skill-a-thon, International & Global Education, Leather Craft, Share the Fun, & Judging.

Retreat registration begins at 7:30 p.m. Nov. 13, followed by general orientation at 9 p.m. and adult chaperone orientation at 9:30 p.m.

Each county sending 4-H youth to the retreat must provide adult chaperones for the weekend.

Nov. 14 activities start at 7:30 a.m., followed by a flag ceremony and breakfast, with the first of the day's three general assembly's beginning at 8:30 a.m. The remainder of the day will have concurrent sessions on the five programming areas.

Evening activities will start at 6:15 p.m. with a flag lowering ceremony and dinner, followed by a 7:30 p.m. presentation on state and national opportunities for 4-H youth and a costumed theme dance.

Adjournment is set for 11 a.m. Nov. 15.

"While this is a learning retreat, the main ingredient for the whole weekend is a sense of fun," Carroll said. "The State 4-H Council members take pride in showcasing their creativity, which will become apparent at the Saturday Night Theme Dance. This year's theme is 'Welcome to the Jungle,' where attendees will come dressed up as their favorite Jungle Animal or character. All the council members plan to be in costume, so it should be fun for everyone."

After the Saturday evening dance, campers will gather for the closing ceremony and to reflect on the day's activities. (Lampasas 4-H will pay ½ of the registration.)

Individual registration is \$115 for youth and \$80 for adult chaperones. The fees include two nights lodging, four meals, snacks and program fees. Online registration is currently available through Nov. 3 at http://texas4hcenter.tamu.edu. The site also provides a property tour and directions.



FOOD & NUTRITION PROJECT (4-H FOOD SHOW & FOOD CHALLENGE etc.)

Practices are every Thursday from 4-5:30pm in October 1, 8, 15, 22 & November TBA until contest. Karen DeZarn will pick up from Lampasas schools if requested. Please RSVP. Classes usually held in County Annex conference room or where individuals arrange with Karen i.e. class rooms at Lometa or Kempner or at schools.

What is the Food & Nutrition project? The food and nutrition project helps participants learn to make healthy food choices, improve energy and alertness, reduce disease and illness risks, and gain knowledge of nutrients. Major learning experiences are centered on nutrition, menu planning, food buying, preparation and food safety, careers, and cultural influences.

A Food & Nutrition project helper(s) is needed. One option is to do a Food & Nutrition display. Topics like maintaining Food Safety, and Kitchen Safety. Recipes submitted should reflect this year's theme, PICNIC PERFECT.

The four Food Show food categories align with MyPlate: protein, fruits and vegetables, grains and dairy. This will allow 12 Lampasas 4-Hers to advance to District, 4 from each of the age groups (Junior, Intermediate, and Senior).

Let the office know if you plan on participating in the Food & Nutrition project be the end of September. The District food show will be on Saturday November 21 in Abilene with county entries due to district by November 10th. Recipes are due to Karen by October 14th. Check the District-7 website for the format at http://d74-H.tamu.edu (under events).

Lampasas 4-H is looking for members to be a part of 4-H - **Food Challenge** which is similar to TV's Iron Chef. The 4-H Food Challenge is a contest that allows 4-H members to demonstrate their culinary knowledge and skills. From a set of predetermined ingredients provided, teams of 3 to 5 4-H members must develop a recipe and prepare the dish within 40 minutes. Teams then make a presentation to a judging panel, explaining the preparation steps, serving size, food safety concerns, nutrition value and cost of the dish. The district Food Challenge contest is December 15 in San Angelo.

We're also hoping to begin Food and Nutrition Teams of 3-4 to compete in the District **Nutrition Quiz Bowl.** A Quiz Bowl helps 4-H members enhance and demonstrate their knowledge and skills in a competitive setting. Two teams compete against each other at one time, answering questions related to the subject matter with the use of an electronic buzzer system. http://fcs.tamu.edu/food_and_nutrition/4-h_youth.php The District Quiz Bowl is November 10 in Coleman.

The theme for 2016 is: 4-H, Ribbons, Awards 7 Recognition. The theme will focus Still Life arrangements of 4-H Awards & ribbons. The arrangement and position of the item will be strongly evaluated as well as the quality of the photo. Photo should create emotion and have impact.

- Attends meetings regularly and is an active participant
- Completes a community service project (or becomes involved in a group community service project)

Leadership Washington Focus

Leadership Washington Focus (LWF) is a 4-H leadership program for youth entering grades 7 through 9. The program will take place at the National 4-H Youth Conference Center, just 1 mile from the Washington, D.C. border. For more than 50 years, thousands of 4-H'ers have participated in our high school program, Citizenship Washington Focus and now we are happy to introduce its precursor for middle school 4-H'ers, LWF. Middle school 4-H delegates will:

- Build confidence in their ability to motivate and direct others in meaningful action
- Practice effective communication with others through group discussion and public speaking
- Work with others to create and accomplish goals
- Develop an understanding of their own personal leadership style
- Exchange ideas, practice respect, and form friendships with other 4-H'ersfrom across the nation.
- Experience hands-on learning using the historical backdrop of Washington, D.C.

Tuition costs for Leadership Washington Focus is \$588.00 (inclusive of tax); tuition includes:

- Lodging at the National 4-H Youth Conference Center for the duration of the program
- All meals during the program
- All site visits during the program
- Transportation during the program (this does not include travel to or from the Center)
- Souvenir pack including: LWF bag, LWF T-shirt, and LWF water bottle

Led by our team of program assistants, delegates will learn by doing and leave LWF with the experiences, tools, and connections to be leaders in their communities today.

Participants will enjoy:

- Motivational speakers and educational workshops that increase individual leadership capability and build lifetime skills for success
- Activities that encourage and form new lasting friendships with other 4-H youth
- An enthusiastic staff of young adults that work directly with them

Participants are immersed in the culture and history of our nation through on-site workshops at D.C.'s most spectacular sights.

Destinations include, but are not limited to:

- White House and Lafayette Park
- Ford's Theatre
- National Archives
- Presidential and war monuments and memorials
- Smithsonian museums
- and more!

One of the week's signature events, called "Nightview," is a spectacular evening tour where delegates will reflect on the different types of leadership conveyed through the symbolism of our national monuments and memorials.

In between tours, youth can relax at the National 4-H Youth Conference Center, Washington, D.C.'s premier youth and leadership hotel . The hotel is situated on a 12-acre campus, minutes from downtown D.C., featuring a hotel café all-you-can eat buffet, 24-hour uniformed security, a fitness center, full-court basketball and volleyball court, recreation room with pool tables and arcade games, free parking, and more.
