<u>Family Safety</u> <u>Swallowing Coin Lithium Batteries – A</u> Serious Threat to Small Children

Simple actions can protect children from a growing safety hazard.

The Risk

Common items like small remote controls,

calculators, watches, car key fobs, flameless tea lights and bathroom scales often have powerful batteries inside, which look like a coin.

• These batteries are extremely dangerous if swallowed.

• Many devices that use coin lithium batteries have easy-to-open battery compartments.

• These gadgets are often left within the reach of children. They may even be favorite play-things or use to entertain kids.

• The batteries are often "invisible" to consumers because they come already inserted in devices.

The Potential Impact

If a coin-sized button battery gets stuck in a child's throat, the saliva triggers an electrical current. This causes a chemical reaction that can severely burn the esophagus in as little as two hours. It is important to know that:

• Damage can continue even AFTER the battery is removed.

• Repairing the damage is painful and can require feeding tubes, breathing tubes and multiple surgeries.

- In some cases, children have died.
- Spotting the problem is difficult. Children can usually breathe with the battery in their throat.

What You Can Do

Parents can take simple steps to protect their children.Look in your home for any item that may contain coin-sized button batteries.

• Place devices out of sight and out of reach of small children.

• Keep loose or spare batteries locked away.

• Share this life-saving information with caregivers, friends, family members and sitters.

If parents or caregivers suspect that a child has swallowed a coin-sized button battery, they should get help fast:

• Go to the emergency room immediately. Tell doctors and nurses that it might be a battery.

• If possible, provide the identification number found on the battery's package.

• Do not let the child eat or drink until a chest x-ray can determine if a battery is present.

• Do not induce vomiting.

MASH Camp

Courtney Dodd, Extension Program Specialist The Medical, Athletic Training, Safety & Health Camp provides youth an opportunity to learn about nutrition, physical activity, health and safety, as well as explore a variety of careers available in the health and medical fields. Activities include tours and hands-on experiences of Texas A&M College of Medicine, Health Science Center, College of Veterinary Medicine, A&M Athletic facilities, and TEEX Disaster City. The camp is scheduled for **June** 27-29, 2012 and is open to youth ages 13-17 (at the time of the camp).

New 4-H Record Book System!

Recordkeeping is a very valuable skill taught to members of the Texas 4-H program. Members are encouraged to keep project records and have these records reviewed annually by submitting a Texas 4-H Record Book. In an effort to update the current *Record Book* system, a committee of 4-H faculty has polled 4-H members, 4-H parents, and Extension faculty to request suggestions to improve the process. It has been highly recommended and requested by many members, parents, and Extension staff that the Texas 4-H recordkeeping system (Record Books) be available as an online, data entry system that easily allows for updates, editing, and printing.

So, State 4-H announced. Important Details:

There will be three (3) levels of Record Books based on 4-H age (junior, intermediate, and senior). Information requested for each level will progressively add on to each other. The junior & intermediate books will be significantly simplified from the current Record Book. The senior level book

will be similar to the current Record Book with some minor edits.

Parts of the report form will be standardized to allow for ease of completion and judging.

Much of the data from previous Record Books that a member may have saved on their home computer may be 'cut and pasted' into the new forms.

All 4-H members (juniors, intermediates, and seniors) will begin using the new online forms or new paper forms that will be available for download from the Texas 4-H website beginning with the 2011-2011 4-H Year.

Record Books will still be printed and turned in (in hardcopy form) to be judged by the deadline set by your local County Extension Office.

- Attend at least 1 range training session. Sun Jan 29 or Sun Feb 12 at 2:00 p.m.
- Attend at least 2 shooting activities. 1-2 activities will be scheduled monthly through April.
- ☐ 4-H Members that have participated in Shooting Sports Project previously must participate in at least 3 shooting activities.

At least 1 shooting activity must be Fun shoot at the Pasture.
